### Children, Young People & Tech Abuse\*

This training goes beyond the basics and explores the ways in which abusers use young people's technology as a part of domestic and family violence and practical ways frontline workers and advocates can support their clients to respond to this risk. Particular attention will be given to court-ordered contact, tech gifts, and social media.

Participants will learn how to potentially distinguish whether stalkerware or other forms of technology are being used and some practical steps and advice in relation to assisting victim-survivors with risk and safety planning around stalkerware, and much more.
